Administration Report

- Last Tuesday fumes entered 2 classrooms at end of hall. Classes evacuated, Health and Safety Officers came in, air quality assessed, students did not return to classroom rest of the day. Officers came back 2 days later, air quality normal, still no known cause
- Wednesday – Safety concern when a student mixed citric acid, baking soda and water in plastic bottle, making a very loud noise. A 45 minute risk assessment was done and it was determined that there was no intent to harm anyone. Admin has dealt with the student and are still looking into the specifics of the incident. The material has been removed from the classroom

Funding Requests

2. Mme. Labeau – Asking for PAC to fund bus transportation to Shumway Lake in June. Have been fundraising @ General Grants.

Motion made for PAC to fund up to \$200 for bus transportation. 1st Linda, 2nd Alex. **PASSED.**

3. Mme. Couchon requesting that PAC fund an author visit (May 6-10). - Isabelle Larouche who was here last year. Would include 3-day writing workshop with Gr. 5's and 2-day presentations for the rest of the school
Barry will get figures from SuperReader program to Mme. Edstrom with the idea that the program can fund most of the visit.

Motion made for PAC to cover the remaining balance after funds from the SuperReader program are used, up to \$2687.61. 1st Alex, 2nd Barry. **PASSED**
